## About the Speaker



Anupam Chander is a leading scholar of globalization and digitization.

A graduate of Harvard College and Yale Law School, he is Director of the California International Law Center, and Professor of Law and Martin Luther King, Jr. Hall Research Scholar at the University of California, Davis.

He clerked for Chief Judge Jon Newman of the Second Circuit Court of Appeals and for Judge William Norris of the Ninth Circuit. He represented sovereigns and corporations at Cleary, Gottlieb, Steen & Hamilton in New York and Hong Kong.

He has been a Visiting Professor at Yale Law School and at the University of Chicago Law School, as well as at Stanford Law School and Cornell Law School. He serves as a senior judge for the Harvard-Stanford Junior International Law Faculty Forum.

He has published scholarship in the leading law journals in the United States, including in the *Yale Law Journal*, the *University of Chicago Law Review*, the *NYU Law Review*, the *California Law Review*, and the *American Journal of International Law*. His work has been translated into Portuguese and French. He co-edited *Securing Privacy in the Internet Age*, published by Stanford University Press. His book, *The Electronic Silk Road*, is forthcoming from Yale University Press.
