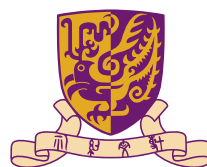

Hong Kong is one of the most exciting places to study law in the world. It is the only common law jurisdiction in East Asia, providing it with a unique legal system and culture. Hong Kong is also a highly internationalised jurisdiction and a global financial centre, which has led virtually all of the world's largest law firms to maintain an active presence here. Hong Kong prides itself on its strict adherence to the rule of law doctrine, a fiercely independent judiciary and a world-class financial regulatory system. Life in Hong Kong has always been shaped by the law. With a world-class legal education system, Hong Kong is uniquely positioned to shape the legal future of Hong Kong and Asia.

The CUHK LLB



CUHK

Established in 1963, with roots traceable to the 1940s, CUHK has the unique mission of bringing together the East and the West. It is highly regarded for its research excellence. Four of its professors, including a former Vice-Chancellor, have been awarded Nobel Prizes.

CUHK provides an environment where students are exposed to a variety of cultures, while enhancing both their Chinese and English language proficiency. CUHK has over 8,000 non-local students drawn from jurisdictions all over the world, including Australia, Canada, mainland China, Germany, Indonesia, Italy, Japan, Macau, Malaysia, Mauritius, New Zealand, Singapore, South Korea, Spain, Taiwan, the United Kingdom, the United States, etc.

CUHK is the only university in Hong Kong to have adopted the collegiate system found in institutions such as Oxford and Cambridge. The colleges create a nurturing environment, offering the chance for interaction with students and staff from other disciplines and backgrounds. They offer residential accommodation and include dining rooms, sports facilities and a wide range of clubs, activities and societies. CUHK LAW

CUHK LAW provides world-class academic and professional education in law. Since its establishment in 2004 CUHK LAW has become a world-leading law school, with 83% of its research activity being rated as 4* ("world leading") and 3* ("internationally excellent") in the most recent HK Research Assessment Exercise, the highest combined 4* and 3* percentage of any law school in Hong Kong.

Choosing to study law at CUHK LAW means many things. It provides the chance to surround yourself with some of the brightest and most committed students in Hong Kong. It provides the opportunity to learn from dedicated academics and lawyers drawn from all parts of the world. It affords the privilege to study at a beautiful campus with top-class facilities. It provides the benefit of studying at the only university in Hong Kong to adopt the collegiate system. Most importantly, it demonstrates the choice to expose yourself to new ideas and challenges, and in so doing, take a first step towards a profession in the practice of which you will be able to help shape the fabric of life in Hong Kong.

CUHK LAW expects its students not only to develop their academic skills and specialised knowledge in a particular area of study, but also to develop the skills necessary for the transition

to full participation as members of Hong Kong society. General education and other non-law courses are available to allow students to study fields outside of law. Participation in the social life of the university community is encouraged. Students have the chance to participate in a wide variety of extra-curricular activities, including joining student clubs and societies and volunteering with social or charitable organisations in Hong Kong. Students also have ample opportunities to take part in overseas exchanges.

CUHK LAW students are among the best and brightest Hong Kong has to offer. Competition for a place of study is fierce — we receive roughly 1,500 applications for about 80 places in the LLB each year. Our students have won top prizes in internationally-recognised moot competitions, graduate scholarships, and training contracts in top international and local law firms. In recent years 80%, on average, of CUHK LLB graduates who sought a place on the Postgraduate Certificate in Laws (PCLL) course—a key step in the process of qualifying as a solicitor or barrister in Hong Kong—have been successful.

Facilities

The Head Office of CUHK LAW is located in the Lee Shau Kee Building, a purpose-built teaching and research facility located in the University's flagship campus in Shatin, New Territories. The Lee Shau Kee Building features a state-of-the-art moot court, a legal resource centre, lecture theatres, classrooms and breakout rooms, all equipped with excellent information technology systems to support the learning activities of LLB students.

Overlooking the scenic Tolo Harbour, CUHK's stunning campus is the largest and greenest in Hong Kong, and won the Gold Award from Hong Kong's Awards for Environmental Excellence. The University offers a wide range of culture, sports and recreational facilities, including seven libraries,

art museums, concert halls, a swimming pool, sports fields, tennis courts, squash courts, a water sports centre and a gymnasium. CUHK LAW has its own dedicated area in the main campus library. The Lee Quo Wei Law Library consists of approximately 124,860 volumes of books and bound periodicals on law or law related subjects. It is complemented by access to a growing array of online sources, including nearly 5,800 e-journals and 107 law databases, as well as the interdisciplinary collections housed in the CUHK Library. The Library provides seating for students in a mix of individual study desks, open plan tables and group study rooms, and offers computers for student use as well as a wireless network for use by students with their own laptops.

Dr. Dicky Tsang is an Associate Professor in the Faculty of Law at The Chinese University of Hong Kong. His main research areas are private international law and company law. Prior to joining academia, he practised as a corporate finance lawyer at Linklaters and Shearman & Sterling. He is admitted to practice in the state of New York, England & Wales and Hong Kong. Dr. Tsang was awarded his LL.B. and PCLL at the University of Hong Kong. He also holds degrees from Georgetown University (S.J.D.), Columbia University (LL.M., J.D.) and University College London (LL.M.).

Double Degree Study Options

CUHK LAW offers LLB students several double degree options, which allow them to pursue their academic interests and enhance their competitive edge.

Bachelor of Laws (LLB) Double Degree Programmes at CUHK

CUHK LAW offers students two double degree programmes in which the LLB can be combined with another course of study: the LLB with a Bachelor of Arts in Translation and the LLB with a Bachelor of Social Science in Sociology. Students will be given the opportunity towards the end of the first year of studies to register for the double degree option, should they wish to do so. After completing the first degree, the second degree can be deferred for up to three years.

Master of Laws (LLM) Programme at the Dickson Poon School of Law of King's College London

In collaboration with the Dickson Poon School of Law at King's College London (KCL), CUHK LAW offers a study option in which LLB students may enroll in KCL's Master of Laws (LLM) Programme. This option provides students with an opportunity to obtain both an undergraduate degree (LLB from CUHK) and a postgraduate degree (LLM from KCL) in four years. Students will spend their first three years at CUHK in Hong Kong and the fourth year at KCL in London. Students will thus study at and obtain degrees from two world-class law schools, gain exposure to two important legal systems, and will as a result put themselves in prime position to acquire high-level global legal careers.



Programme Structure

The CUHK LLB is a full-time four year academic journey designed to expand students' intellectual capabilities.

The LLB provides students with the training necessary to enter into a well-regarded profession as well as the tools and knowledge to be engaged and responsible members of the broader community. Students will learn of Hong Kong's shared heritage with other common law legal systems around the world as well as its place within the broader Chinese legal context. The LLB includes the study of not only the practical elements of Hong Kong's legal system, but also the theoretical and normative perspectives that undergird it. This approach provides students with a comprehensive understanding of the laws and legal principles upon which Hong Kong's society is founded and operates.

Intellectual coherence is the overarching principle which guides the ordering and grouping of subjects, and which sets the CUHK LLB apart from comparable degree programmes.

The first two years in the CUHK LLB contain compulsory subjects, grouped together into three themes: Foundations of Law, Public Law and the Law of Obligations. The next two years consist of both electives and pre-requisite courses for admission to the PCLL. Students may organise their academic programme so as to leave space for a term or an entire year abroad, if they wish. Elective courses vary year to year. Students may elect a particular stream of specialisation in either Global Law or Chinese Law. Students may also personalize their study by selecting elective courses clustered around particular sub-areas of legal investigation.

Teaching and Learning



CUHK LAW has a very diverse faculty with professorial and professional members from 20 jurisdictions. The Faculty's professors are internationally recognised specialists in a great variety of fields, and the professional consultants offer real-world experience in the practice of law. Together, they offer our LLB students the very best legal education in Hong Kong in all areas of study and practice. At CUHK LAW, no matter which area of law attracts your interest, you will find an expert in our Faculty.

Mentorships

Students enjoy a close mentoring relationship with Faculty members – each student is assigned an Academic Advisor to help ensure success both in legal studies and in university life in general. CUHK LAW's priority is to provide you with an excellent legal education that prepares you for your future career and aids you in developing as a lifelong learner.

The Sir TL Yang Society Distinguished Professional Mentor (DPM) Programme plays an indispensable role in shaping the success of our LLB graduates. This unique mentorship programme is designed to give individual LLB students the opportunity to meet and receive advice from experienced legal professionals. Through this initiative, the LLB students can develop the necessary skills and confidence to be effective and ethical professionals. All LLB students are invited to the Annual Reception for Distinguished Professional Mentors at the Sir TL Yang Society High Table dinner.

As part of that programme each of our undergraduate students is also paired with a "Distinguished Professional Mentor" who is available to them during their last three years of study at CUHK LAW. These mentors are drawn from the legal community in Hong Kong, including the judiciary, solicitors and barristers, the government and businesses and other commercial and non-governmental institutions. All undergraduate students are first introduced to their mentors at a special reception at the end of the student's first year of study and thereafter the initiative is designed to give them the opportunity to obtain practical guidance on issues associated with a future legal career and to help ease them into professional life.

The Sir TL Yang Society, named after a former Chief Justice of Hong Kong and Honorary Professor at CUHK LAW, provides many other opportunities throughout the year to hear expert speakers and meet distinguished guests. It also provides up to HK\$10,000 to every student to be used for Summer Study Abroad Programmes.

Overseas Exchanges & Summer Study Abroad Programmes (SSAP)

Students participating in an SSAP travel as a group and study short courses from leading professors at top law schools outside of Hong Kong, while also participating in local cultural and professional activities. Current summer programme locations include Tsinghua University in mainland China, Osgoode Hall Law School at York University in Canada and Thammasat University in Thailand. All the SSAPs are designed and run exclusively for the benefit of CUHK LAW students.

Over 270 term or year-long foreign student exchange programmes at University, Faculty and College levels also offer the opportunity to study worldwide. These programmes can broaden students' life experience and academic understanding. Credits earned abroad may count towards completing the LLB.



Mooting

Mooting gives students a taste of life as a lawyer presenting written and oral arguments in complex hypothetical court cases. CUHK LAW students annually participate in internal, local, regional and international moot competition competitions. CUHK LAW has enjoyed great success in all moot competition competitions since moot was first offered in 2006.

CUHK LAW encourages students to participate in moot competition competitions. Participation may attract course credits towards degree completion. An academic staff member advises each team and supervises its work. Practice moots take place in the state-of-the-art Warren Chan Moot Court at the Graduate Law Centre and Moot Court in the Shatin campus.

CUHK LAW moot teams have achieved notable results in international moot competition competitions as highlighted below:

- Championship in the Herbert Smith Freehills Competition Law Moot in 2019 in the UK.
- Championship in the 2012 Law Asia International Law Moot in Indonesia.
- Championship in the Leiden- Sarin International Air Law Moot Court Competition 2022 and 2024.
- Championship in Vis (East) International Commercial Arbitration Moot 2016 and 2020.
- Won the regional rounds and received the Dillard Award for Memorial Writing in the Philip C. Jessup International Law 2022.
- Placed first and won several awards including the Best Team Overall, the Best Regional Memorial for Asia, the Best Defense Counsel Memorial, the Second Runner-up for Best Memorial, and the Second Runner-up for Best Prosecution Memorial, in the International Criminal Court Moot Court Competition 2020.

Scholarships

There are academic scholarships at University, Faculty and College levels. Within CUHK LAW there is a student-run law society and a student-run law magazine. Students are encouraged to take advantage of the many opportunities that the Faculty offers.

Professor Queenie Lai, Associate Dean for Teaching and Learning, is a graduate of the University of Cambridge and has practised as a corporate solicitor at international law firm Clifford Chance's Hong Kong, Shanghai and London office. She has taught for over a decade at the CUHK LAW, where she specialises in teaching corporate practice. Professor Lai was a two-time recipient of CUHK LAW's Excellent Teaching Award and was awarded the UGC Teaching and Development and Language Enhancement Grant for her Simulated Client in Professional Legal Education Project. She is a member of the University Senate Committee of Teaching and Learning and chairs the Faculty's Teaching and Learning Committee and Teaching Excellence Award selection panel.



Career Success & Careers Facilities

Most of our students intend, after completing their degree, to sit the Postgraduate Certificate in Laws (PCLL) before moving on to careers in legal practice, many aiming for top law firms and barristers' chambers, with some choosing to take legal positions in government or industry. Others move into areas where a law degree can give them a useful advantage – such as regulatory compliance, investment banking or financial services, with a number choosing to remain in academia. In all cases their achievements are testimony to their hard work and the quality of their education.

Law Student Careers Office

The Faculty's Law Student Careers Office provides students with guidance on career choices, applications and interviews as well as assistance with career preparation and professional development. The Director, Mr. Paul Mitchard KC, has prepared a programme of seminars on career and professionalism topics which includes presentations by representatives of law firms, barristers' chambers and other prospective employers.

Virtual Careers Resource Centre

The Law Student Careers Office also maintains a Virtual Careers Resource Centre (VCRC) which serves as a contact point for prospective employers, teaching faculty members and students. The VCRC contains a Legal Careers Directory with up-to-date information on law firms and chambers, including on their internships, training contract and pupillage/mini pupillage policies and application procedures. The VCRC website (<https://www.law.cuhk.edu.hk/app/student-careers/>) also notifies job opportunities and forthcoming careers seminars and other events. It also provides students with information on matters such as job applications and CV preparation and with a wide range of other career-related resources designed to ensure that CUHK LAW students are fully informed and equipped for entering into what today is a challenging and rapidly-changing jobs market.

E-mentoring

The Careers Office also supports an e-mentoring programme through which students may connect with CUHK LAW alumni in their chosen field for career guidance and help with achieving the level of 'employability' and professionalism which many employers require. In this regard, Mr. Mitchard says:

"The demands of legal recruiters are becoming increasingly sophisticated: it is therefore important for students, right from the start of their university career, to keep abreast of what is going to be required of them in addition to academic achievement and to take steps to enable them to meet those demands."

From 2001 until his retirement in 2014, Mr. Mitchard was a partner at the US law firm of Skadden Arps, where he set up and headed the firm's litigation and arbitration practice in Europe and Asia. He was Visiting Professor of Law at the China University of Political Science and Law in 2012-15.

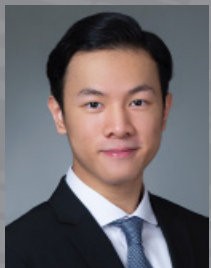

Admissions

CUHK LAW admits approximately 80 outstanding new members to the LLB student body every year through the JUPAS and Non-JUPAS routes. There are no shortcuts to the application process: each application will be carefully evaluated on the basis of academic merit and overall quality.



JUPAS (Code: 4903)

Prospective students taking the Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education (HKDSE) examination should apply through the Joint University Programmes Admissions System (JUPAS). Applicants must fulfil the following minimum requirements in order to be considered. However, meeting these requirements does not guarantee admission – in the past, the vast majority of admitted students have far exceeded them.

Prospective students who do not apply on the basis of the HKDSE should apply through the Non-JUPAS route. Most Non-JUPAS applicants apply on the strength of their results in the International Baccalaureate (IB), GCE Advanced-Level examinations, or other comparable secondary school qualifications.
