Life in Hong Kong has always been shaped by the law. With a world-class legal education system, Hong Kong is uniquely positioned to shape the legal future of Hong Kong and Asia.

The Chinese University of Hong Kong (CUHK)

Established in 1963, with roots traceable to the 1940s, CUHK has the unique mission of bringing together the East and the West. It is highly regarded for its research excellence. Four of its professors, including a former Vice-Chancellor, have been awarded Nobel Prizes.

CUHK provides an environment where students are exposed to a variety of cultures while enhancing both their Chinese and English language proficiency. Non-local students at CUHK come from a wide range of jurisdictions around the world, including Australia, Canada, Mainland China, Germany, Indonesia, Italy, Japan, Macau, Malaysia, Mauritius, New Zealand, Singapore, South Korea, Spain, Taiwan, the United Kingdom, the United States, and more.

CUHK is the only university in Hong Kong to have adopted the collegiate system found in institutions such as Oxford and Cambridge. The colleges create a nurturing environment, offering the chance for interaction with students and staff from other disciplines and backgrounds. They offer residential accommodation and include dining rooms, sports facilities and a wide range of clubs, activities and societies. CUHK LAW

CUHK LAW provides world-class academic and professional education in law. Since its establishment in 2004, CUHK LAW has become a world-leading law school, with 83% of its research activity being rated as 4* ("world leading") and 3* ("internationally excellent") in the most recent Hong Kong Research Assessment Exercise, the highest combined 4* and 3* percentage of any law school in Hong Kong.

Choosing to study law at CUHK LAW means many things. It provides the chance to surround yourself with some of the brightest and most committed students in Hong Kong. It provides the opportunity to learn from dedicated academics and lawyers drawn from all parts of the world. It affords the privilege to study at a beautiful campus with top-class facilities. It provides the benefit of studying at the only university in Hong Kong to adopt the collegiate system. Most importantly, it demonstrates the choice to expose yourself to new ideas and challenges, and in so doing, take a first step towards a profession in the practice of which you will be able to help shape the fabric of life in Hong Kong.

CUHK LAW expects its students not only to develop their academic skills and specialised knowledge in a particular area of study, but also to develop the skills necessary for the transition to full participation as members of Hong Kong society. General education and other non-law courses are available to allow students to study fields outside of law. Participation in the social life of the university community is encouraged. Students have the chance to participate in a wide variety of extra-curricular activities, including joining student clubs and societies and volunteering with social or charitable organisations in Hong Kong. Students also have ample opportunities to take part in overseas exchanges.

CUHK LAW students are among the best and brightest Hong Kong has to offer. Competition for a place of study is fierce. Our students have won top prizes in internationally-recognised mooted competitions, graduate scholarships, and training contracts in top international and local law firms. In recent years, 80%, on average, of CUHK LLB graduates who sought a place on the Postgraduate Certificate in Laws (PCLL) programme — a key step in the process of qualifying as a solicitor or barrister in Hong Kong—have been successful.





Programme Structure

The CUHK LLB is a full-time four year academic journey designed to expand students' intellectual capabilities.

The LLB provides students with the training necessary to enter into a well-regarded profession as well as the tools and knowledge to be engaged and responsible members of the broader community. Students will learn of Hong Kong's shared heritage with other common law legal systems around the world as well as its place within the broader Chinese legal context. The LLB includes the study of not only the practical elements of Hong Kong's legal system, but also the theoretical and normative perspectives that undergird it. This approach provides students with a comprehensive understanding of the laws and legal principles upon which Hong Kong's society is founded and operates.

The first two years in the CUHK LLB contain compulsory subjects, grouped together into three themes: Foundations of Law, Public Law and the Law of Obligations. The next two years consist of both electives and pre-requisite courses for admission to the PCLL. Students may organise their academic programme so as to leave space for a term or an entire year abroad, if they wish. Elective courses vary year to year. Students may select a particular stream of specialisation in either Global Law or Chinese Law. Students may also personalise their study by selecting electives courses clustered around particular sub-areas of legal investigation.

Professor Steven Gallagher teaches equity and trusts, property law, art and culture heritage law, and digital technology and law on the LLB, JD, and LLM courses. He also provides solicitors' continuing professional development courses on various property related topics and digital technology and law, and risk management courses for solicitors in using artificial intelligence and advising on crypto transactions. He teaches a course for high school students introducing the law entitled “Superheroes and the Law.”

Double Degree Study Options

CUHK LAW offers LLB students several double degree options, which allow them to pursue their academic interests and enhance their competitive edge.

Bachelor of Laws (LLB) Double Degree Programmes at CUHK

CUHK LAW offers students two double degree programmes in which the LLB can be combined with another course of study: the LLB with a Bachelor of Arts in Translation and the LLB with a Bachelor of Social Science in Sociology. Students will be given the opportunity towards the end of the first year of studies to register for the double degree option, should they wish to do so. After completing the first degree, the second degree can be deferred for up to three years.

Master of Laws (LLM) Programme at the Dickson Poon School of Law of King's College London

Master of Laws (LLM) Programme at the University of Southern California Gould School of Law

CUHK LAW offers two joint study options in partnership with King's College London (KCL) and the University of Southern California (USC). Under these options, students may enrol in the Master of Laws (LLM) Programme at KCL or USC in their fourth year. This provides students with an opportunity to obtain both an undergraduate degree (LLB from CUHK) and a postgraduate degree (LLM from KCL or USC) in four years.

Students will thus study at and obtain degrees from two world-class law schools, gain exposure to two important legal systems, and will as a result put themselves in prime position to acquire high-level global legal careers.

Professor Miao is a renowned scholar in comparative law, criminal justice, and law & technology, whose distinguished career includes prestigious appointments as NYU Global Fellow, Oxford Howard League Fellow, British Academy Postdoctoral Fellow, NUS ASLI Scholar, Harvard Yenching Scholar, and most recently CASBS Fellow at Stanford University, culminating in her receipt of the American Society of Comparative Law's prestigious Hessel Yntema Prize, which recognises her as the field's most outstanding scholar under 40 worldwide.



Teaching and Learning



Overseas Exchanges & Summer Study Abroad Programmes (SSAP)

Our Summer Study Abroad Programmes (SSAP) allow students to travel as a group and take short courses taught by leading professors at top law schools outside Hong Kong. These programmes also include cultural and professional activities in the host country. Current destinations include Tsinghua University (Mainland China), Osgoode Hall Law School at York University (Canada), and Thammasat University (Thailand). Each SSAP is designed exclusively for CUHK LAW students.

In addition, CUHK offers over 270 term or year-long exchange programmes at the University, Faculty, and College levels. These opportunities allow students to study abroad, broaden their academic horizons, and gain valuable life experience. Credits earned during these exchanges may count toward the LLB degree.

Mooting

Mooting gives students a taste of life as a lawyer presenting written and oral arguments in complex hypothetical court cases. CUHK LAW students annually participate in internal, local, regional and international moot competition. CUHK LAW has enjoyed great success in all moot competition since moot was first offered in 2006.

CUHK LAW encourages students to participate in moot competition. Participation may attract course credits towards degree completion. An academic staff member advises each team and supervises its work. Practice moots take place in the state-of-the-art Moot Court in the Shatin campus and Warren Chan Moot Court at the Graduate Law Centre in Central.

CUHK LAW moot teams have achieved notable results in international moot competition as highlighted below:

- Championship in the Herbert Smith Freehills Competition Law Moot in 2019; Best Advocate and a Certificate of Outstanding Advocacy Skills in 2025.
- Championships in the Leiden- Sarin International Air Law Moot Court Competition 2022 and 2024.
- Championships in the Willem C. Vis East International Commercial Arbitration Moot in 2016 and 2020; Honourable Mention for Best Written Memorandum for Claimant in 2025.
- Werner Melis Award for Best Respondent Memorandum, Martin Domke Award for Best Oralist, and Eric E. Bergsten Award for Best Team Orals (Top 16) in the Willem C. Vis International Commercial Arbitration Moot in 2025.
- Regional Round Winner and Dillard Award for Memorial Writing in the Philip C. Jessup International Law in 2022.
- First Place Winner, Best Team Overall, Best Regional Memorial for Asia, Best Defense Counsel Memorial, Second Runner-up for Best Memorial, and Second Runner-up for Best Prosecution Memorial in the International Criminal Court Moot Court Competition in 2020.

Scholarships

CUHK LAW students have access to a wide range of academic scholarships offered at the University, Faculty, and College levels. Within the Faculty, students can also participate in a student-run law society and contribute to a student-run law magazine. We encourage all students to take full advantage of the many enriching opportunities available at CUHK LAW.

CUHK LAW is proud to have a richly diverse faculty, comprising both academic and professional members from about 20 jurisdictions. Our professors are internationally recognized experts across a wide range of legal disciplines, while our professional consultants bring invaluable real-world experience to the classroom. Together, they deliver an exceptional legal education to our LLB students, covering all major areas of law. Whatever your legal interests may be, you'll find a knowledgeable and supportive expert within our Faculty.

Mentorships

At CUHK LAW, students benefit from close mentoring relationships with Faculty members. Each student is paired with an Academic Advisor who provides guidance not only in legal studies but also in navigating university life. Our goal is to support your academic success and help you grow into a lifelong learner prepared for a rewarding legal career.

The Sir TL Yang Society Distinguished Professional Mentor (DPM) Programme is a cornerstone of our mentorship offerings. This unique initiative connects LLB students with seasoned legal professionals who offer personalized advice and support. Through this programme, students gain the skills and confidence needed to become ethical and effective practitioners. All LLB students are invited to the Annual Reception for Distinguished Professional Mentors, held during the Sir TL Yang Society High Table Dinner.

Each undergraduate student is matched with a Distinguished Professional Mentor at the end of their first year at CUHK LAW. These mentors come from various sectors of Hong Kong's legal community, including the judiciary, private practice, government, business, and NGOs. Students are introduced to their mentors at a special reception at the end of their first year, and the relationship provides practical insights and guidance as they prepare for professional life.

Named after a former Chief Justice of Hong Kong and Honorary Professor at CUHK LAW, the Sir TL Yang Society also hosts events throughout the year featuring expert speakers and distinguished guests. Additionally, it offers up to HK\$10,000 to each student for participation in Summer Study Abroad Programmes.

Facilities

The Head Office of CUHK LAW is located in the Lee Shau Kee Building, a purpose-built teaching and research facility located in the University's flagship campus in Shatin, New Territories. The Lee Shau Kee Building features a state-of-the-art moot court, a legal resources centre, lecture theatres, classrooms and breakout rooms, all equipped with excellent information technology systems to support the learning activities of LLB students.

Overlooking the scenic Tolo Harbour, CUHK's stunning campus is the largest and greenest in Hong Kong, and won the Gold Award from Hong Kong's Awards for Environmental Excellence. The University offers a wide range of culture, sports and recreational facilities, including seven libraries, art museums, concert halls, a swimming pool, sports fields, tennis courts, squash courts, a water sports centre and a gymnasium.

CUHK LAW has its own dedicated area in the main campus library. The Lee Quo Wei Law Library consists of approximately 125,000 volumes of books and bound periodicals on law or law related subjects. It is complemented by access to a growing array of online sources, including nearly 6,400 e-journals and 103 law databases, as well as the interdisciplinary collections housed in the CUHK Library. The Library provides seating for students in a mix of individual study desks, open plan tables and group study rooms, and offers computers for student use as well as a wireless network for use by students with their own laptops.

Career Success and Careers Facilities

Most of our students intend, after completing their degree, to sit the Postgraduate Certificate in Laws (PCLL) before moving on to careers in legal practice, many aiming for top law firms and barristers' chambers, with some choosing to take legal positions in government or industry. Others move into areas where a law degree can give them a useful advantage – such as regulatory compliance, investment banking or financial services, with a number choosing to remain in academia. In all cases their achievements are testimony to their hard work and the quality of their education.

Law Student Careers Office

The Faculty's Law Student Careers Office provides students with guidance on career choices, applications and interviews as well as assistance with career preparation and professional development. The Careers Office has prepared a programme of seminars on career and professionalism topics which includes presentations by representatives of law firms, barristers' chambers and other prospective employers.

Virtual Careers Resource Centre

The Law Student Careers Office also maintains a Virtual Careers Resource Centre (VCRC) which serves as a contact point for prospective employers, teaching faculty members and students. The VCRC contains a Legal Careers Directory with up-to-date information on law firms and chambers, including on their internships, training contract and pupillage/mini pupillage policies and application procedures. The VCRC website (<https://www.law.cuhk.edu.hk/app/student-careers/>) also notifies job opportunities and forthcoming careers seminars and other events. It also provides students with information on matters such as job applications and CV preparation and with a wide range of other career-related resources designed to ensure that CUHK LAW students are fully informed and equipped for entering into what today is a challenging and rapidly-changing job market.

Vis International Commercial Arbitration Moot held in Vienna. While these competitions were both challenging and intense, it has taught me discipline and resilience.

Moreover, CUHK LAW provides a wide range of exchange opportunities. I was fortunate to study at Osgoode Hall Law School, allowing me to delve into specific legal areas of interest and connect with students from diverse jurisdictions.

I am truly grateful for the opportunities that CUHK LAW has facilitated in my career.

Admissions

CUHK LAW admits approximately 70 outstanding new members to the LLB student body every year through the JUPAS and Non-JUPAS routes. There are no shortcuts to the application process: each application will be carefully evaluated on the basis of academic merit and overall quality.



JUPAS (Code: 4903)

Prospective students taking the Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education (HKDSE) examination should apply through the Joint University Programmes Admissions System (JUPAS). Applicants must fulfil the following minimum requirements in order to be considered. However, meeting these requirements does not guarantee admission – in the past, the vast majority of admitted students have far exceeded them.

Non-JUPAS

Prospective students who do not apply on the basis of the HKDSE should apply through the Non-JUPAS route. Most Non-JUPAS applicants apply on the strength of their results in the International Baccalaureate (IB), GCE Advanced-Level examinations, or other comparable secondary school qualifications.

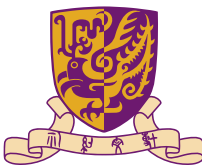
