

Overview of the JD Programme



The Juris Doctor (JD) is a versatile postgraduate law degree that leads potentially to admission as barrister or solicitor in Hong Kong. It is also suitable for candidates who strive to become leaders in fields such as commerce, finance, academia, government, community service, law enforcement, public administration, education and the media. The JD is a respected and internationally recognised award many universities in leading jurisdictions abroad confer. CUHK LAW teaches and assesses all JD Programme courses entirely in the English language.

YOUR POSTGRADUATE LAW DEGREE

The JD Programme gives students an intellectually enriching foundational education in law that also lets them study a wide range of challenging elective courses in the common law, Chinese law, comparative law, international law, and the law of trade, business and finance. CUHK LAW encourages JD students to look behind the contemporary rules of law to the values, purposes and policies underlying them.

The JD Programme offers a rich and diverse teaching environment. Classes are taught by academic staff drawn from jurisdictions around the world and our JD students often join a diverse group of students from our Master of Laws (LLM) or other law programmes in classes. The JD Programme is a taught Master's degree and it is not customary for JD graduate to use the title, "Doctor".

With CUHK as its home, experienced and dedicated international teachers and a strong focus on students, the JD Programme gives students an unparalleled opportunity for professional and academic growth.

The JD Programme has already established itself as a leader in professional legal education in Hong Kong and the East Asian region.


Enriched by the intellectual and cultural heritage of its University and at the heart of the legal system, CUHK LAW brings together common law and Chinese law with other great legal traditions and values to promote justice and safeguard the rule of law.

An international family of research-led scholars offers dynamic and flexible learning conditions. Students are encouraged to develop a deep and critical understanding of legal theory and practice. Graduates will possess the intellectual skills and ethical values to enable them to become future leaders and better serve the needs of the community.

Supported by world class research, CUHK LAW provides a flexible, learner-centred environment in which students are actively engaged and prepared for distinction in the legal profession and for leadership roles in Hong Kong, China, and internationally.

CUHK LAW is building strong and enduring links with alumni and friends so that law students are educated and fully equipped for successful careers in the legal profession, government, business, and industry.

JD Programme Requirements



term-length courses, each worth 3 units). Students may enroll in full-time or part-time mode of study. Full-time students can complete the JD Programme in as short as 24 months (the normative study period) or as long as 48 months (the maximum study period). Part-time students can complete the JD Programme in 42 months* (the normative study period) or as long as 84 months (the maximum study period).

To graduate, students must complete four required courses. These are Comparative Legal Studies, Legal System, Legal Research, Analysis and Writing and Ethics and Jurisprudence. CUHK LAW provides these required courses to give JD students the foundational knowledge and skills for a well-rounded general legal education and a first-hand appreciation of the relationship between the legal system and the broader community it serves and regulates. Moreover, all students must complete a mandatory research component by undertaking either Independent Research or the more extensive Independent Research Dissertation. In this research component, students should demonstrate a mastery of legal research and writing and the capacity to think creatively about law.

CUHK LAW offers its own innovative Postgraduate Certificate in Laws (PCLL) Programme. Students aspiring to be admitted as a barrister or solicitor in Hong Kong must pursue courses stipulated by the Hong Kong legal professions. Students who pass these may then apply to be admitted to the PCLL Programme. These courses are also open to students who do not plan to enter the PCLL Programme.

Our JD students choose elective courses from a wide range of intellectually enriching and professionally enhancing offerings. Reading these subjects enables our JD students to complete their degree requirements while expanding their intellectual breadth and furthering their professional goals.

Most JD courses are worth 3 units. Students will have an average of 3 contact hours per week with teachers in each course. CUHK LAW holds classes during daytime and evenings of weekdays and daytime on Saturdays. Evening classes typically begin at 6:30pm. Classes incorporate a mix of lectures, seminars, presentations and class discussion.

Finally, all students must meet the minimum cumulative GPA required by the University for postgraduate programmes before they may graduate.


Our Student Profile

The CUHK JD Programme is distinguished not only by the strength and global character of its academic faculty, but also by the quality and breadth of its student body.

Admission to the JD Programme is highly competitive. Every year, around half of our students are admitted with an undergraduate degree awarded with first class honours, a doctorate, a Master's degree with distinction or a Bachelor's degree with borderline first class honours (or equivalent). The remaining students are admitted with a strong second upper class degree or equivalent. A significant proportion of our students have received one or more of their degrees outside Hong Kong, frequently at leading universities in North America, Europe, China and Australasia. Our students' academic backgrounds cover virtually every discipline, from accountancy to zoology. This mix of students enriches the JD teaching and learning experience.

Banding of students admitted to the JD Programme




Band 1 35% First Class Bachelor's degree or PhD or equivalent



Strong Second Upper Class Bachelor's degree or credit Master's degree or equivalent


Geographic origins of Bachelor's degree

Our International Academic Faculty

CUHK LAW has a strong team of experienced academic staff from various jurisdictions with world-known expertise in many areas. Some come from extensive practice backgrounds, having held senior positions in legal practice and other fields across many jurisdictions. All strive for excellence in teaching and research and are committed to educating students in the law by drawing on their diverse teaching, research and professional experience.

Learning Environment

GRADUATE LAW CENTRE

CUHK LAW delivers all JD courses in the CUHK Graduate Law Centre, located in Hong Kong's central business district at 2/F, Bank of America Tower, Central. Teaching facilities in the Graduate Law Centre include the Warren Chan Moot Court, lecture theatres, classrooms and breakout rooms. All rooms are equipped with state-of-the-art facilities. The Graduate Law Centre also has a Legal Resources Centre, a computer laboratory and a student common area with computer stations that serve all postgraduate students undertaking their studies. JD students also have access to facilities on the CUHK main campus in Shatin on the same basis as other postgraduate students of the University.



International Exchange

Exchanges give students the opportunity to travel to new places, to meet new people, to experience new cultures, to learn new subjects, to refresh their minds and to impress future employers.

JD students may transfer credits they earn abroad to count towards their degree requirements. In addition to university-wide exchanges, which cover more than two hundred destinations, CUHK LAW offers faculty-based exchanges. Through these, students may study abroad at Washington College of Law of American University (USA), Benjamin N. Cardozo School of Law of Yeshiva University (USA), the Faculty of Law of Maastricht University (Netherlands), the School of Law of Bocconi University (Italy) and Osgoode Hall Law School of York University (Canada).



Mooting

Mooting gives students a taste of life as a lawyer presenting written and oral arguments in complex hypothetical court cases. CUHK LAW students annually participate in internal, local, regional and international mooting competitions. CUHK LAW has enjoyed great success in all mooting competitions since mooting was first offered in 2006.

CUHK LAW encourages students to participate in mooting competitions. Participation may attract course credits towards degree completion. An academic staff member advises each team and supervises its work. Practice moots take place in the state-of-the-art Warren Chan Moot Court at the Graduate Law Centre and Moot Court in the Shatin campus.

CUHK LAW moot teams have achieved notable results in international mooting competitions as highlighted below:

- Championship in the Herbert Smith Freehills Competition Law Moot in 2019; Best Advocate and a Certificate of Outstanding Advocacy Skills in 2025.
- Championships in the Leiden-Sarin International Air Law Moot Court Competition 2022 and 2024.
- Championships in the Willem C. Vis East International Commercial Arbitration Moot in 2016 and 2020; Honourable Mention for Best Written Memorandum for Claimant in 2025.
- Werner Melis Award for Best Respondent Memorandum, Martin Domke Award for Best Oralist, and Eric E. Bergsten Award for Best Team Orals (Top 16) in the Willem C. Vis International Commercial Arbitration Moot in 2025.
- Regional Round Winner and Dillard Award for Memorial Writing in the Philip C. Jessup International Law in 2022.
- First Place Winner, Best Team Overall, Best Regional Memorial for Asia, Best Defense Counsel Memorial, Second Runner-up for Best Memorial, and Second Runner-up for Best Prosecution Memorial in the International Criminal Court Moot Court Competition in 2020.

Career Success and Careers Facilities

Most of our students intend, after completing their degree, to sit the PCLL before moving on to careers in legal practice, many aiming for top law firms and barristers' chambers with some choosing to take legal positions in government or industry. Others move into areas where a law degree can give them a useful advantage – such as regulatory compliance, investment banking or financial services, with a number choosing to remain in academia. In all cases their achievements are testimony to their hard work and the quality of their education.

Law Student Careers Office

The Law Student Careers Office provides students with guidance on career choices, applications and interviews as well as assistance with career preparation and professional development. The Law Student Careers Office has also prepared a programme of seminars on career and professionalism topics which includes presentations by representatives of law firms, barristers' chambers and other prospective employers.

Virtual Careers Resource Centre

The Law Student Careers Office also maintains a Virtual Careers Resource Centre (VCRC) which serves as a contact point for prospective employers, teaching faculty members and students. The VCRC contains a Legal Careers Directory with up-to-date information on law firms and chambers, including on their internships, training contract and pupillage/mini-pupillage policies and application procedures. The VCRC website (https://www.law.cuhk.edu.hk/app/student-careers/) also notifies job opportunities and forthcoming careers seminars and other events. It also provides students with information on matters such as job applications and CV preparation and with a wide range of other career-related resources designed to ensure that CUHK LAW students are fully informed and equipped for entering into what today is a challenging and rapidly-changing job market.



Admission Requirements



APPLICANTS TO THE JD PROGRAMME MUST HAVE:

- graduated from a recognised university and obtained a Bachelor's degree in a non-law subject or a law degree from a non-common law jurisdiction, normally with honours not lower than Second Class: or
- graduated from an honours programme of a recognised university with a Bachelor's degree in a non-law subject or a law degree from a non-common law jurisdiction, normally achieving an average grade of not lower than "B" in undergraduate courses; or
- completed a course of study in a tertiary educational institution and obtained professional or similar qualifications equivalent to an honours degree.

Applicants may apply for admission to the JD Programme before having completed a Bachelor's degree (or equivalent) provided they are in the final year of study for a Bachelor's degree (or equivalent). In these cases any offer will be subject to the condition that applicants satisfy requirements for graduation in their Bachelors' degrees (or equivalent) and for admission to the JD Programme before commencing the JD Programme.

APPLICANTS MUST ALSO SATISFY THE ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENT BY:

- possessing a Bachelor's degree obtained by completing a programme of study in Hong Kong or an English-speaking country, or which was taught primarily in the English language; or
- achieving a result of Band 7.5 or better in the International English Language Testing System (IELTS), which result was obtained not more than two years prior to the date of applying to join the JD Programme; or
- achieving a result of 600 (Paper Based Test), or 100 (Internet Based Test) or better in the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL), which result was obtained not more than two years prior to the date of applying to join the JD Programme: or
- providing alternative evidence of English proficiency equivalent to one of the preceding measures.
