An Empirical Study of Chinese Investment in the US and Its Implications As FDI outflow from China surges, scholars and policymakers in the US have been debating its impacts on extant US institutions. Some view the economic expansion as a threat; others see it as making valuable contribution to the fragile economic recovery in the US and Chinese investors as readily "playing our game." Using a survey of Chinese companies investing in the US, this paper analyzes the adaptation of Chinese investors. The study finds Chinese companies to be highly adaptive, so their investments will have limited effects on extant US institutions in the near future.
